RIVER SPEY WEEKEND. The beginning of June saw the much vaunted **Spey Weekend** with a good number of members staying at the Loch Park bunkhouse, and paddling on the River Spey in kayak and canoe on the Saturday, and then splitting with some heading for the River Findhorn and others on the River Spey (at two separate locations) on the Sunday. It was agreed by all present that an enjoyable time was had and this type of activity should be encouraged. OPEN CANOE TRAILER. The club committee sought to replace the club trailer last autumn – we had a valuable trailer which wasn't really suitable for our needs. After some discussion it was decided to sell the trailer and then with the proceeds, engage a local firm to build firstly, an open canoe trailer (this would fit nicely with the plan to



increase open canoe resources); and secondly, to ask the same firm to build a kayak trailer. The open canoe trailer has been delivered, and has already been in use transporting the new canoes around. The photo shows the trailer in use at Forfar Loch recently. As for the kayak trailer, it is hoped to have the trailer in about 3 weeks time.

TAY DESCENT. 23rd and 24th October sees this years annual [Canoe and Kayak Show](#), Paddle 2010. An increasingly popular weekend, a new event is to take place this year, the [Tay Descent](#). Club member Pete Ritchie has volunteered to co-ordinate a club entry / trip – so please get your name to [Pete](#) asap, even if it is just to register an interest at this stage. There are deadlines to registration for the event, and there are also advantages in doing so, so please do get in touch with [Pete](#).

FOUNDATION SAFETY AND RESCUE. As the name suggests, this course can be seen as a beginners course in canoe and kayak safety – not just your safety, but also those around you. Imagine the day you are on a club trip and someone near you gets into difficulty. What would you do? This course is for all and is an essential element of a paddlers learning and experience. As a club coach, I rely on members abilities when I take trips. Indeed, the venue for any trip is dictated, in part, by the abilities of those paddlers taking part on the day. Some weeks ago the club arranged for an FSRT course, at heavily discounted costs, for club members – it had to be postponed because of the lack of uptake. The committee would like to reschedule the course, provisionally for the 26th September. Whether or not the course goes ahead will depend upon numbers – and No, you don't need to be a particularly competent paddler to take part, and Yes, juniors will be welcome too!
